



NEW RESIDENT INFORMATION

On behalf of the officials and staff of the Village of Indian Hill, welcome! Our community is an exceptional place to live, work, and raise a family. From highly rated schools to majestic greenspaces, Indian Hill is a great place for living, learning and leisure.

The approximately 5,000 residents of Indian Hill enjoy the Village's exceptional services from Public Safety and Water Works to Public Works and Recreation.

Indian Hill Rangers

The Indian Hill Rangers are the primary law enforcement agency for the Village. They strive to increase safety, improve the community's quality of life, and prevent crime through engaged policing strategies. Once you move into the Village, the Rangers request that you visit the department in person to provide emergency contact information and to register for 24-hour residential alarm monitoring. Water Works

The Indian Hill Water Works manages the water supply as well as the distribution maintenance services to Indian Hill and surrounding areas from wells on the Little Miami aquifer. Once you move into the Village you can call the Water Works office at 513-561-6679 to establish service. Water Works bills are issued quarterly. Payments can be made in-person at the Water Works office, through the mail, or online at www.ihill.org.

Public Works

- Ordinary household waste is collected weekly. Holidays falling on a regularly scheduled day will be rescheduled for Monday. Large quantities of trash or bulk items such as furniture and appliances are considered special pickups and are collected upon request for a fee.
- Recycling is collected bi-weekly. All recycling can be put into one can or toter and does not need to be separated.
- Yard waste, including grass, weeds, and leaves, must be placed in brown paper bags and is collected upon request at no charge. Brush should be cut and stacked and is collected upon request for a fee.

Tax Department

To fund its municipal services, the Village has a mandatory residential income tax. This requires that all individuals who reside in Indian Hill for any part of a calendar year file an Indian Hill tax return.

- The residential tax rate for tax year 2020 is set prospectively at .525%.
- Indian Hill tax is non-reciprocal. Taxes paid to another locality do not change the amount due to Indian Hill.
- Estimated payments are not required.
- Your Indian Hill tax return MUST include a complete copy of your State of Ohio tax return. Without this your return cannot be processed.

Grand Valley Nature Preserve

Grand Valley is a 379-acre wildlife preserve located in Camp Dennison. An extensive restoration has returned this former gravel quarry to its natural beauty. Visitors can enjoy miles of walking trails as well as a central lake ideal for canoeing, kayaking, and fishing. Grand Valley is open dawn to dusk daily.

- An access card is required to enter Grand Valley. Access cards are available in-person at the Village Administration Office. A photo ID will be required.
- Each household can receive one card free of charge. An additional card may be purchased for \$10.00. There is a limit of 2 cards per household.
- Access cards can only be used by members of the household to whom the card was issued. The access cards may not be loaned to anyone else.

Shooting Club

The Indian Hill Shooting Club, located in Camp Dennison, provides a place for shooters of all interests to practice and enjoy shooting sports. The Shooting Club is set up for both Rifle and Pistol Shooting as well as Skeet and Trap, on alternating days. Memberships for residents are \$125.00 annually. Applications are available at the Village Administration Office, and first-time applicants must appear in person to obtain a membership.

Bridle Trail Membership

The Village maintains a network of 75 miles of bridle trails. A bridle trail license is required to ride. Memberships for residents are \$75.00 per rider annually. Applications are available at the Village Administration Office, and first-time applicants must appear in person to obtain a membership. Guest passes are available for a small fee for guests riding with bridle trail members.

Rowe Arboretum

The Stanley M. Rowe Arboretum is a public arboretum owned by the Village and operated as a non-profit organization. Covering 9 acres, it has been cited for a remarkable collection of conifers, magnolias, oaks and beeches. The Arboretum is open to the public at no charge from dawn to dusk daily.

Indian Hill Directory

In partnership with the Indian Hill Boy Scouts, the Village maintains a Directory listing all addresses in the Village and resident information as provided. ONLINE PAYMENTS

THE VILLAGE BULLETIN

The Village publishes a monthly Bulletin designed to inform residents about Village activities and projects. All residents receive the publication by mail. An online subscription is also available at ihill.org/bulletin.

CODE RED NOTIFICATIONS
